
Queensland Museum acknowledges the First Peoples – the Traditional Custodians of the lands, waters and sky where we live and work.

RECONCILIATION TOURS AT QM

CUSTOMS, CULTURE AND COUNTRY.

Queensland Museum is the State's leader in positive action for Repatriation. Our Repatriation and First Nations teams work with industry, research partners and Community to progress the Repatriation of Secret and Sacred Objects within the State collection, in line with the needs and expectations of Community.

At the same time, QM is committed to deepen public knowledge around local First Nations Story Telling and recognising the place of this land's First scientists, environmental managers, engineers, explorers, traders, artists and peacebuilders .

Our goal is to help reframe Queensland's relationship with Aboriginal peoples and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

To support corporate cultural capacity building and facilitate Reconciliation journeys, QM is offering expert-curated tours of our First Nations Collections.

These tours are unique opportunities to gain insights into diverse First Nations cultures and practices, the significance of the items as part of a living culture and human stories attached to them. QM experts will also share our organisational learnings in working with First Nations communities and how we are embedding First Nations perspectives across our work.



TOUR OPTIONS

We will work with you to customise the tours to align with your priorities or share stories and collections from the regions you operate in.

Tour fees will support the conservation of First Nations collections, helping us preserve these stories for future generations.

Back of House tour group numbers will need to be capped at 15 pax per session.

Expert-led Back of House (BoH) visit – 1.5 hrs

Spend 1.5 hrs with our experts, walking through the Museum's First Nations collections and sharing knowledge from community and Country that enhance your Reconciliation journey and cultural understanding.

Cost: \$5500 ex. GST

Director's BoH visit – 2 hrs

An extended BoH tour led by our Director of First Nations, Dr Bianca Beeton. A Kabi Kabi (Sunshine Coast) Wiradjuri (NSW) woman and a celebrated leader in Queensland, Dr Beeton will share her expert insights as an artist, an academic, a community advocate and a Traditional Owner as you connect with the collection

Cost: \$7000 ex. GST

Expert talk and BoH visit – 2 hrs

What does coral research, study of shipwrecks or biodiversity science have to do with Reconciliation?

Start your tour with a talk and discussion with one of our cultural or scientific researchers as they share how they are embedding First Nations knowledge in their work and taking a community-led approach to education and outreach.

Followed by a BoH walk through the First Nations collections, as the discussion continues.

Cost: \$7500 ex. GST
